NAFTO, in conjunction with Evansville Police Department, is proud to offer our newest course, Beyond the Basics of Field Training, in **Evansville, IN, a 15-minute drive from Evansville Regional Airport**. This training is designed for experienced Field Training Officers in Patrol, Detention, Communications, and Support Services, as well as Field Training Sergeants, Coordinators, and Administrators.

COVID-19 PROTOCOL *Read Thoroughly*

In order to abide by all Federal, state, county, and local restrictions and guidelines, the following protocols are required, **not optional**, for attendance: Students will be spaced out in a large facility to provide for social distancing. Students, instructors, and staff will wear masks. Masks are cloth face coverings that sufficiently cover the mouth and nose and do not have exhalations valves. Hand sanitizer will be provided for student use.

Due to special limitations, attendance numbers are limited. We anticipate this class will sell out very quickly. Due to limitations on seating, payment is required at the time of registration, unless other arrangements are made.

Refunds will not be provided for classes during Covid-19 restrictions. However, substitution of students is always permitted. Any students who are not paid 15 days prior to class will have their registration vacated.

Beyond the Basics of FTO Course

Created specifically to address the needs of experienced FTO's, this class will re-energize and focus Field Training Officers that have experience training and evaluating trainees in the fields of Patrol, Corrections, and Communications. This course is not designed as a basic certification, but offers advanced remedial training techniques, insight into human behavior, discussions on leadership vs management, the FTO's role on socialization and the importance of proper documentation.

Going even further beyond the basics of Field Training, this two-day course will also provide insight on the various concepts and methodologies surrounding the idea of managing an FTO program. How can the FTO or the unit manager have influence over program productivity and efficiency? In what way can the FTO improve upon their own performance? How crucial is the culture of your FTO program to department-wide ethics? How can you tie up loose ends in the realm of liability to avoid costly lawsuits? Day 2 of this advanced class will offer answers to these questions and give the student a glimpse into managing the FTO and the FTO program.

This class covers such topics as Generational Leadership, Standardizing Evaluation Guidelines, Adult Learning, and Ethics. Each block of study is directed at the trainer, and ways to improve their teaching, work product, and approach to today's Officer In Training. Information includes motivating different generations of trainees, career survival for the FTO, and case law review pertaining to evaluations.

Seating limited to the 1st 30 applicants, no exceptions, and we expect this class to sell out quickly.
Refunds are not granted during Covid-19 restrictions, but a substitution of students is permitted.

Cost - \$250 per student, which includes training materials and 1-year membership to NAFTO.
