

Asian Male group is too small in number to draw significant conclusions from the % of force usage in arrests.

#### **Conclusion**

The analysis was conducted by reviewing all standard Use of Force reports which were submitted during the year 2023. Evansville Police Department procedures require that in all instances where physical force is utilized, a report is made. In each case, a supervisor reviewed the use of force following the incident. Although there are several similarities, there is no pattern evident that would indicate a flaw in the training or procedural rules of using force. The results further do not indicate any patterns of unusual amounts of force being used by any one shift or sector of officers.

#### **Reasons for initiating pursuits:**

- Traffic violation 3 (37.5%)
- Subjects wanted for other than above -5 (62.5%). Of these, the stops were for subjects wanted on a warrant, for driving a stolen vehicle, and/or as part of an investigation.

#### **Summary**

EPD's officers received training in Emergency Vehicle Operations in 2023. All pursuits during the year have been reviewed by a supervisor. The overall number of pursuits has dropped by 267% from 2022. The decrease is due, in part, to officers' adjustment to more restrictive Department Operational Guidelines governing pursuits. The average distance of a pursuit in 2023 would have been ½ mile and the average top speed for a pursuit in 2023 would have been 56 mph.

### **Internal Affairs Complaints**

#### **Informal Complaints**:

The Internal Affairs Unit processed nineteen (19) Informal Complaints in 2023. The complaints involved a total of twenty-nine (29) counts. With regards to the twenty-nine (29) individual counts against officers, eight (8) were found to be Sustained, eleven (11) were ruled Unfounded, nine (9) were found to be Exonerated, and one (1) of the counts was ruled Non-Sustained after investigation by the involved officer's unit.

#### **Formal Complaints**:

Internal Affairs investigated one (1) Formal Complaint during 2023. There were other complaints, that in the past, may have been Formal Complaints, however, with the availability of Body Cam Evidence, the validity of the complaints were able to be investigated and determined to be unfounded.

#### **Complaint Inquiries**:

Another fifty-eight (58) Informal Complaints reported were handled directly by the Internal Affairs supervisor as the complaints were more of an inquiry by nature. These included complaints about traffic citations and complaints about arrests; to which the complainants were advised these were matters for the court system and not the Internal Affairs Unit.
